

PE Kit Policy

We have just launched a new PE kit policy to take effect immediately. This has been done to ensure that the whole school follows the correct procedure and all children have the correct kit for PE lessons.

Getting changed

All children must bring in a full PE kit which should **not** be worn to school in the morning. Children should get changed in school.

Children should not go home in PE kit at the end of the day.

Forgetting kit

If your child forgets their kit, the first and second time they will be allowed to take part in PE wearing a kit provided by the school. The school has 2 spare kits per year group, which will be handed out on a first come first served basis. If your child forgets their kit for a third time a phone call/text will be made to you asking the reason for this. The child will not be allowed to take part in the lesson, they will instead complete a PE worksheet based on the learning taking place.

If a child still fails to bring a kit into school, the safeguarding team will be contacted, as it is the right of a child to have a kit and take part in PE, and it is part of the National Curriculum.

PE kit should be appropriate (fit for purpose). If deemed inappropriate parents will be contacted.

Not taking part

If your child cannot take part in PE for any reason a letter or note must be provided by you; unless the child has a serious injury/illness they will be expected to take part. It is our expectation that if your child is well enough to come to school they are well enough to take part in PE.

Clubs

If your child has a club after school, your child should bring a separate kit in for the club and not wear the PE kit that is used for PE lessons.

Children should not get changed for clubs until 3.30pm.

Red and Yellow cards

Your child will **not** receive a yellow card for not bringing in a kit.

School PE Kit

School PE kit is navy blue t-shirt and royal blue shorts. A t-shirt with the logo is available from PTs in Radcliffe. This is suggested and not enforced.
